

A patient advocate supports individuals affected by cancer and helps patients navigate from diagnosis to survivorship. Advocates have been there and can help newly diagnosed patients prepare for what is ahead. Hearing someone's personal experience is often the best way to learn about treatment options.

ADVOCACY OPPORTUNITIES:

1. ON YOUR OWN:

There are often opportunities at social-meetings, fundraising events, support groups, and more to talk about your cancer journey. For example, you may be a member of a local organization that has speakers at meetings or attend an informal gathering like a crafts group and be able to talk about your experience and help someone newly diagnosed with cancer.
